Recovery Center @ Woodburn

For many people with serious mental illness, it is hard to believe in a hopeful future, where recovery is possible and goals are within reach. The challenges they face in the community, in life, and in traditional systems of care are daunting — and the resources to overcome these challenges are few.

The Recovery Center @ Woodburn (WRC) exists to help these individuals build skills, reclaim hope, and feel supported on their journeys of recovery. WRC offers a new clinical approach, one that is dramatically different than the traditional sub-acute locked facility. The program embraces the recovery philosophy at all levels instead of focusing primarily on symptom and behavior management. Recovery is woven into and defines every aspect of the program, from assessments and interventions, to the resident information system, to the selection of staff, and the overall resident experience.

Services

The Recovery Center @ Woodburn is a 24-hour Secure Residential Treatment Facility for individuals transitioning from the Oregon State Hospital who are under the jurisdiction of the Psychiatric Security Review Board. Our main focus is to ready individuals to move to a less restrictive environment by offering training in all domains of a person's life. To these ends, WRC offers skills training in: Self-Care, Medication Management, Community Navigation, Housekeeping, Meal Preparation, Job Readiness, Wellness, Communication, and Money Management. WRC also provides vocational rehabilitation opportunities that allow residents to work in the community. WRC partners with many local community-based organizations to offer our residents the opportunity to begin building a foundation for when they leave the program.

Referral Process

Individuals must be referred to Recovery Center @ Woodburn by the Psychiatric Security Review Board.

Admission criteria falls under the jurisdiction of the Psychiatric Security Review Board.

Why This Program Was Started

The Recovery Center @ Woodburn was founded as a first step in the transition of Oregon State Hospital forensic patients into the community. Individuals coming to WRC were found guilty, except for insanity, for a serious crime and are under the jurisdiction of the Psychiatric Security Review Board (PSRB). WRC houses 15 men in a secure setting where unsupervised outings in the community are controlled by the PSRB and WRC jointly. This robust partnership between WRC and the PSRB creates a system in which community safety and individual development coexist in an effective and cost-efficient manner.

WRC provided the State of Oregon a resource to reduce hospital over-crowding and comply with the federal Americans with Disabilities Act while reducing costs by 40%. WRC is the largest privately run PSRB SRTF in the state.

Outcomes

The Recovery Center @ Woodburn has placed numerous individuals at lower levels of care, further preserving state resources. No individual who has graduated from the Recovery Center @ Woodburn has returned to the state hospital.
